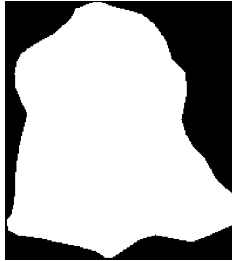

The NEWFOUNDLAND CLUB OF THE CAROLINAS was THE FIRST Dog Club to ever be invited as Honored Guests to W. Kerr Scott Federal Park in Wilkesboro, North Carolina and to hold the FIRST Newfoundland Event on their lake's gorgeous beach at Berry Mountain and we're invited back!

This year, we have 4 special women joining us and one is one of our very own; Beckie Stanevich, from West Virginia. Beckie has owned Newfs since 1980 and has participated in conformation, obedience, agility, carting and search & rescue with her Newfs. She is also a CGC evaluator.

Currently she owns two English Springer Spaniels in addition to one ten-year-old Newfie. Her primary activity now is search and rescue. Her Newf, Flo Jo is now retired, but was certified in wilderness air scent, cadaver and water cadaver. Beckie is now doing urban search and rescue with the Springers. These are the dogs that search for people missing in collapsed buildings after disasters.

Part of the training of a disaster dog includes making them proficient in obedience and agility. Rascal (one of the Springers) was such a good pupil that she went ahead and competed with him. He now has his Rally Novice, Novice Obedience, Novice Jumpers with Weaves, and Novice Agility titles through the AKC. And, hopefully he'll pass his FEMA test in December to become a FEMA certified disaster dog!

Beckie will be providing us with useful information for Obedience, Rally Obedience, Tracking (scent work) & Search and Rescue (SAR) and will also CGC (canine good citizen) evaluate those who are ready to take the test.

Also joining us is Joan Gunn of Harvard, Illinois

Joan has owned Newfoundlands since 1984 and has produced over 20 champions, and over 30 titlists, 7 of which are VN's (Versatile Newfoundlands) earning their: CD (Companion Dog), DD (Draft Dog), WD (Water Dog), WRD (Water Rescue Dog) titles.

And Tammy Taskey and Tammy Hensley of Seymour, Indiana.

Both Tammy(s) have owned Newfoundlands since 1999 and have also earned titles in conformation and the above working titles along with the VN title.

## About the Workshops

In no particular order (illustrations by Shirl Katchmore)

### Carting/Draft Work

This workshop will be an introduction of draft work, demonstrations and view draft equipment along with learning Basic Control

{Heel off lead - forward, slow, fast, normal, right turn, left turn, about turn, and halt.

A recall - dog stays in place until called by owner.

A group down - down your dogs, (remove lead), leave your dogs, return to dogs}

and hands-on harnessing, hitching, & equipment check, maneuvering course and basic-commands.



### Water Dog Training

This workshop will focus on the basics of getting you and your Newf in the water and will teach the basic skills for water training: basic control, retrieving, carrying and pulling.

{Single Retrieve, Drop Retrieve, Take a Line, Tow a Boat, Swim with Handler}

By the end of the day you will learn the fun of water work and have the necessary skills to train your dog for the junior water exercises! You will also have the experience of properly riding on a boat-platform with your dog and see demonstrations of the senior water exercises.



### Obedience & Rally Obedience

A short introduction to obedience and Rally, the differences and similarities will also be discussed. Novice Rally exercises will be demonstrated and everyone can practice with an experienced helper. A Novice Rally course will be set up so you can see how easy and fun Rally is for you and your Newf!!

### Search (scent tracking) & Rescue (SAR)

A brief description of what it takes to be a SAR handler/trainer and a SAR dog. A discussion of how dogs find people and some fundamentals search dogs must have. How we start dogs will be demonstrated with your dogs if desired.

The CGC (Canine Good Citizen)

CGC testing will be available on Friday evening and Saturday only for Newfs 6 months old or older. The test is \$5. per dog. There are 10 test descriptions you must pass in order to receive a CGC Certificate: Accept a friendly stranger, Sitting politely for petting, Appearance and grooming, Out for a walk (loose lead), Walking through a crowd, Sit and down command and staying in place, Come when called, Reaction to another dog, Reaction to distraction, and Supervised separation. ## Meals:

Registration fees include Saturday's dinner. We will be having a fabulous Italian Spaghetti Dinner at Berry Mtn's shelter, which includes rolls, drinks and deserts.

For Friday and Sunday you can eat out at any of the dining places in town, or order in delivery pizza, or bring a cooler full of picnic items & drinks.

There is also a grill for grilling hot dogs or hamburgers, so if everyone can bring their own drinks and one item to share, (bag of chips, package of hot dogs, package of hot dog buns, cookies or brownies, etc) there'll be plenty to go around.

- Water & bowl, dog food and treats!
- Drool rags, and ESPECIALLY POOP BAGS!
- Grooming equipment (for CGC & for after swimming) including dog dryer - if have one
- A pop-up canopy, if you have one, to set up on the beach for shade.

OBEDIENCE/RALLY/SCENTWORK:

- A long line/rope (Such as clothes line, or \$ stores usually have 50 ft leads)
- Variety of favorite toys, and lots of treats.

## THINGS TO BRING FOR YOU & YOUR FAMILY:

- Water shoes, or extra old sneakers for water (Mandatory), + regular shoes
- A life jacket for you (Mandatory, but will share if needed)
- Wet suit, bathing suit & protective clothes from Newf nails in water!
- Lots of towels for you AND your Newf!!!!!!
- Folding or lawn chairs, or blanket
- Camping gear if camping, wood, marshmallows, first aid kit, umbrella
- Clothes for warm & cold weather, lake wind can cold at night!
- Cooler of food & drinks, snacks, BAG of APPLES for a GAME!
- If you have a blow-up raft, or canoe, bring them.
- AND CAMERAS!!!!!!!!!!

Other activities you may do at Kerr Lake:

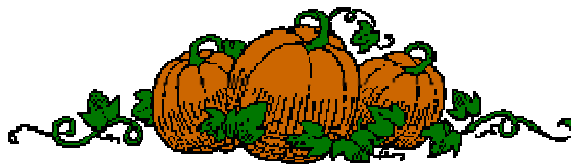
- Boating, Skiing, fishing, canoeing, bicycling on trails, & more.

## DIRECTIONS

To W. Kerr Scott Reservoir (places all are on the same Kerr Lake)

To Visitor Assistance Center (Maps and other neat things-open 8am to 4:30 pm (Mon-Frid)

Directions from Hwy 421: Take exit 286 B, turn onto Hwy 268 W, go 3 miles, turn right onto Reservoir Road at the W. Kerr Scott Dam and Reservoir sign, go ¼ mile, then turn left.

To Bandits Roost Campground

336-921-3190 (for direction assistance only- do not call this number for reservations!!)

Directions from Hwy 421: Take exit 286 B, turn onto Hwy 268 W, go 5.5 miles, then turn right onto Jess Walsh Road, just past the Goshen Fire Department.

IF you are a REGISTERED NCC Member, or Guest, your name will be on a list at Gate House, otherwise they won't let you through!!! There's usually a line at the gate check-in so come early!

To Berry Mountain Park & Beach

There are no restrooms at Berry Mtn, please use restrooms at Bandits Roost upon arrival

Head I-85 NORTH

Proceed approximately 5 MILES to I-77, STATESVILLE/COLUMBIA exit

Veer LEFT onto I-77 NORTH toward STATESVILLE

Proceed approximately 55 MILES (passing towns referenced on map)

RIGHT onto EXIT 73B, HWY 421N to NORTH WILKESBORO

Proceed approximately 20 MILES

DO NOT EXIT 421 NORTH!

Proceed through 3 STOPLIGHTS

ADDISON INN is on the RIGHT just past McDonalds and McAlister's Deli

From Greensboro, NC

I-40 WEST toward Winston-Salem

Follow I-40 Express (Do not take I-40 Business) approximately 20 miles

Exit RIGHT onto HWY 421 NORTH toward Yadkinville/North Wilkesboro

(Exit is more of a Right Fork and is past the Hanes Mall Blvd. and Stratford Rd. exits)

Follow HWY 421 NORTH approximately 50-55 miles.

DO NOT EXIT 421 NORTH!

Proceed through 3 STOPLIGHTS

Addison Inn is on the RIGHT just past McDonalds and McAlister's Deli.
